Arwa's Story:

Refugee from Palestine Helped by Montreal City Mission

In 2017, Arwa was a Palestinian refugee who had just arrived in Montreal, travelling from Saudi Arabia through New York City with three children in tow. "It wasn't easy for me. I was a single mom in a new country with new people. I was struggling for housing and looking for a job," she says.

Arwa sought help at Montreal City Mission, an outreach ministry your Mission & Service gifts support. It wasn't long before Arwa gathered a group of women to form a catering cooperative. The group was going strong and the women were becoming more financially secure when COVID-19 struck.

No stranger to hardship, Arwa initiated a sewing circle to make cloth masks—over 2,000 of them for unhoused people and people with low incomes in their community. Arwa's extraordinary leadership skills landed her a full-time job at Montreal City Mission.

"I consider myself a lucky person that I got to know this organization. It has become not only my full-time job, not only my provider. It has become my home. I hope to see more and more women getting the same chance to have this better life for their families," she says.

In a year of continuing pandemic, unexpected war, rising inflation, and local emergencies, communities of faith continued to support those in need in Canada and around the world.



Grandmothers in Kenya: Fighting Discrimination through Education

In the Rift Valley of Kenya, nearly 900,000 of the people who live there are HIV positive—and many will not survive. Grandmothers whose children have died of AIDS are often left to care for their grandchildren. Condemned by church communities taught that faithful Christians cannot contract the disease, they are left without support.

"The pastors had little information about HIV and AIDS... [They believed] HIV was a result of sexual sin and was a judgement from God," writes Esther Mombo of the World Council of Churches.

In partnership with the United Church, Mombo and Pauline Wanjuru of St. Paul's University in Limuru, Kenya, led a series of workshops, inviting grandmothers and pastors to connect and learn.

One grandmother bravely shared her story. She had lost two children to AIDS and was raising three grandchildren on her own. Her neighbours refused to visit her. Her pastor wouldn't attend her children's funerals. When she went to church, the pastor preached about the punishment for sexual immorality. She shared how it felt to be shamed for loving her children and grandchildren.

The pastors listened, and made a commitment to extend compassion and offer pastoral care to the grandmothers.

Your Mission & Service gifts gave these grandmothers the opportunity to help their pastors learn to do better by connecting their love for their grandchildren to God's love for all. Thank you.

One grandmother shared how it felt to be shamed for loving her children and grandchildren... another spoke of God's love for everyone.

Families who are fleeing war are given food, clothing, shelter, medical supplies, and a place to be safe.




