Sample from The United Church of Canada children's curriculum, *I Am a Changemaker: Teaching Anti-Racism with Children*. Available from the United Church Bookstore, ucrdstore.ca. This six-session curriculum for leaders of children aged 6–12 supports teaching anti-racism, raising anti-racist children, and advancing racial equity in a faith-based way.

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Glossary

- If you don't have the technology to show the videos during a session, you could simply read the poems or send the YouTube links ahead of time to children's caregivers.
- Make intentional links between what the children are exploring with this curriculum and what is happening in the rest of the worship service by sharing updates on what the children are doing or showing some of the videos in worship. You might also share a prayer together, bless the children as they go to church school if they leave the service partway, or use one of the poems in worship.

However you adapt this curriculum, continue to create an inviting space where everyone can talk openly about racial equity.

Welcome and Weekly Opening Activity

Read the "Grounding and Intention Setting" poem. This is also available as a *Pvideo*.

Consider reading it first slowly to the group without doing the actions, asking them to simply listen. Take your time reading the lines, letting the meaning and weight of the words wash over the room as you pause to enjoy their invitation.

If you read the poem a second time, everyone could follow along with the movements prompted by the poem. Feel free to add actions for emphasis and direction. For example, use your fingers to count to five, place your hand on your belly so that everyone can see your belly expand as you breathe in, and do all of the other actions in an exaggerated way.
