GATHERING WITH GOD

CALL TO WORSHIP

LISTENING FOR GOD

FAMILY TIME

The following is a skit for four voices. It begins with Voice One holding a hammer and nails, poised to begin hammering a nail into an imaginary wall.

Voice One: This looks like a lovely place to build my house. I have a pile of wood over here, nails there, and my trusty hammer. It's a good thing too, because I am the best person around with a hammer and nails. I can build this house myself. (*Begins to move the hammer back to make a first swing.*)

Voice Two: (*interrupting before the first nail is hit*) Whoa! Whoa! What are you doing?

Voice One: I am building my house right here.

Voice Two: Well it's a lovely spot. And I know you are the best with a hammer, (*Voice One flexes his or her muscles*) but something's missing.

Voice One: What's missing? I have a hammer, lumber, and nails.

Voice Two: Your house needs a foundation to keep your floor dry and your house strong against a storm. Luckily, I am the best foundation person in the business!

Voice One: Great! My house will have a great foundation and great carpentry. We're all set.

SCRIPTURE AND SERMON SUGGESTIONS

- Share some examples from creation of parts working together for some goal or need.
- Recall a time when you or someone you know felt overwhelmed by a task until others came to help. Allude to the Family Time skit if you used it.
- Select Old Testament and New Testament stories of people overwhelmed by a task or situation. Examples include Moses needing help as he settled disputes (Exodus 18:13–23), Ruth and Naomi (Book of Ruth), Jeremiah enabled to speak with God's help (Jeremiah 1:4–10), or the first community in Acts pooling their resources so there would be no need (Acts 4:32–37).
- Recall that Christ calls us to community, not to individualism.
- Give some basic facts/examples about Mission and Service, inserting examples from your Conference where you can. (See pages 46-48.) Include some of the statistics from page 26.
- By working together, we enjoy many rich blessings. Mission and Service is not just another fund appeal. It is a call to go deep into how we think of others, of ourselves, and of God.
